



CLIMATE ZONES - Four of the world's five major climate zones and all but four of the world's subzones* can be found here, creating an ecosystem unlike any other! *Original Köppen Classification System

WORLD'S TALLEST MOUNTAIN - Maunakea - when measured from its base on the seafloor - 33,500 ft. [≈10.2km]; 13,796 ft. [≈4.2km] from sea level. Mt. Everest is 29,029 ft. [≈8.8km] above sea level.

MORE COASTLINE - 266 miles [≈428km] of coastline and the most marine conservation districts in the State.

WORLD'S MOST MASSIVE MOUNTAIN -

With a volume estimated at 18,000 cubic miles $[\approx75,027 \mathrm{km^3}]$, Maunaloa rises to about 13,100 ft. $[\approx4 \mathrm{km}]$ above sea level. Maunaloa is the world's second tallest mountain when measured from its base on the seafloor - 29,500 ft. $[\approx9 \mathrm{km}]$. The seabed is further depressed by Maunaloa's great mass by another 26,200 ft. $[\approx8 \mathrm{km}]$, making its summit 55,700 ft. $[\approx17 \mathrm{km}]$ above its base!

WATERFALLS - One of many waterfalls on the northeastern coastline, 'Akaka Falls is the State's tallest "sheer drop" waterfall at 442 ft. [≈145m], more than twice the height of Niagara Falls at 167 ft. [≈50.9m].

FLOWER POWER - The island is home to several lush, tropical botanical gardens and floral nurseries - one of its nicknames - "Orchid Isle."

STELLAR SKIES - The entire Northern Hemisphere and about 90% of the Southern Hemisphere can be seen from here - perfect for stargazing!
